Mr. Norton discussed ADOSH's inspection, summarized the citation and proposed penalties, and reviewed the photographs.

Chairman Kavanaugh and Mr. Norton discussed that the distance between the eyewash station and the area where the chlorine was being used would make it difficult to get to the eyewash station in the event of an exposure.

Commissioner LeMarr moved to amend citation 1, Item 2 to delete the penalty because he was not convinced by the photographs that the eyewash station is it not accessible. Vice Chair Hennelly seconded the motion.

Vice Chair Hennelly asked Mr. Norton about abatement. Mr. Norton commented that the fit testing and respiratory medical evaluation were set up, but he did not know about the abatement for the eyewash.

Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner LeMarr, Commissioner Everett and Commissioner Valdez voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Mr. Norton discussed ADOSH's inspection, summarized the citation and proposed penalties, and reviewed the photographs.

Chairman Kavanaugh checked if anyone would like to comment.

Ms. Zeidler commented that they were notified and that day they immediately purchased the proper safety canister for the gasoline and submitted those receipts. She also provided the fall protection certifications for the employees which they had but copies were not present at the time,

but have been provided along with the training program. They were not wearing their harnesses which has been a big thing for them and everything had been addressed within 24 hours by the Production Manager.

Chairman Kavanaugh noted the Commission was aware of the correction of the gasoline can and appreciate the additional information.

Ms. Zeidler noted she would like Item 2 to be removed.

Mr. Norton commented that in reviewing the file, there is information that during the interviews with one of the employees, he explained he had been employed with the employer for a year and had not received any training with the company since being hired, supporting the reasons the citation was recommended.

Chairman Kavanaugh asked if it was possible that the training information was subsequently sent to the investigator. Mr. Norton noted it is possible and that the only abatement list in the file was the abatement of the gasoline can and can go back and check on that abatement.

Chairman Kavanaugh asked Ms. Zeidler if she had the date the information was sent. Ms. Zeidler noted she did not have it in front of her.

Mr. Norton noted that in the notes there are comments from one of the management representatives on site, the Project Manager, he was unsure of what the roofing requirements were as well.

Ms. Zeidler commented that everyone on site are now in compliance.

Chairman Kavanaugh confirmed Ms. Zeidler's comments that training materials are available now in the event there are future inspections.

Vice Chair Hennelly wants to determine if the materials were sent in for abatement purposes.

Chairman Kavanaugh requested it be continued to the next meeting (still before the six month time period expires) and the Commission will take action at the October 26th meeting.

Ms. Zeidler noted she could re-send that information to Ms. Stonerock.

Announcements, Scheduling of Future Meetings and Retirement Resolutions.

Ms. Dimas confirmed Commission meeting dates through December 2023.

Ms. Padgett announced Melissa Spurgeon has been selected as the Labor Director and noted her experience and background.

Chairman Kavanaugh congratulated Ms. Spurgeon.

There was no public comment.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:42 p.m.
